HISTORY:

Built in 1942, Tooele Army Depot (TEAD) was originally named the Tooele Ordnance Depot (TOD) and opened as a storage depot for war supplies, ammunition, and combat vehicles. In 1949, TOD assumed command of the Deseret Chemical Depot (DCD). TEAD acquired the general supply storage mission from Pueblo Army Depot in Colorado in 1988. Following Base Realignment and Closure in 1993, troop support maintenance & storage missions were relocated. TEAD retained its conventional ammunitions logistics support mission. In 2013, TEAD regained additional storage capacity from the now-closed DCD & renamed the location TEAD South Area. TEAD is a government-owned, government-operated (GOGO) depot.

FACILITIES:

TEAD is located on more than 44,000 acres and consists of 479 dedicated and skilled personnel, occupying 3,158 buildings/igloos, with storage capacity of 2.8 million square feet. In addition, the Depot serves as a Southwest Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) staging site for disaster response. The expansive depot and commercial distribution network is the gateway to the Pacific providing rapid movement by air, rail, ground or sea.
